School day

- Playground is supervised from 8.30 onwards
- Bell goes on playground at 8:40
- Any late arrivals must report to the school office and sign in
- At the end of the school day the school gate will be opened at 3:15, allowing parents entry to collect their children from the classroom door (Infant pupils) and playground (Junior pupils).

School day

- The office is open from 8.00 until 4.15p.m.
- If you need to speak to a teacher in the morning, please leave a message with the office.
- Contact should be made with the office via phone/email wherever possible
- The office will make appointments if you wish to see a member of staff.

<u>Attendance</u>

- It is a legal requirement that children attend school.
- Appointments should be made outside of school times wherever possible.
- Applications for time out of school should be made to the headteacher, however, authorised absences will only be sanctioned for exceptional circumstances.

Keeping Children Safe

- Please call us if your child is sick, please inform us promptly. We need to check they are not harmed on the way to school.
- Please let us know of arrangements for collecting your child or allowing them to walk home on their own.
- Please don't use your mobile phone to take pictures in school.
- Pupils are not allowed mobile phones in school.
- Be aware of your child is doing online and support safe practices.

A Healthy School

- A healthy snack is available for your child at break time at a cost of 30 pence.
- Children are encouraged to drink water throughout the school day. Please ensure they have a clear, see-through sports-type water bottle in class (may be purchased from the school office).
- **Healthy school dinners** ensure that children are able to keep learning throughout the day. Lunches are free for pupils in the Infant school (supported by school funding) and are available for Junior pupils at £2.30 per day. There is a wide range of choices available including a sandwich choice. Please book lunches choices on-line via our School Money site.
- Healthy Schools status in line with this, no chocolate-covered snacks or crisps please.
- Food allergy information Please ensure that we hold up-to-date pupil information. Sacred Heart School operates as a nut-free zone.

Free school meals & Pupil Premium

In KS1, every child is eligible for a universal free school meal.

Due to being a healthy school, the children are able to book a hot dinner, jacket potato or choice of sandwiches each day.

'Pupil Premium'

If you feel you are eligible for free school meals, due to low income, then please talk to the office. We receive additional PP funding for those who are registered and can support in a number of ways.

- Please ensure you have a complete PE Kit for PE days, with a school tracksuit for when the weather gets colder. Pupils are to come to school dressed in PE kits on their timetabled PE days which are Monday and Friday.

Reading at home

Payments to school

- School Money is the method of payment for all monies coming into school except for snack or fund-raising events
- School fund
 - Donations gratefully received
- Dinner money
 - FOR INFANT PUPILS No payment is required
 - Dinner choices need to be ordered in advance
- Snack money pupils' responsibility

Wraparound Care

- Our charges are currently £4 per hour: this is half price or negotiable for pupils for whom we receive Pupil Premium funding.
- Breakfast club runs daily from 7.30 to 8.30a.m. It is available to pupils in Reception – Year 6. There is a charge of £4.00. A place needs to be booked online, in advance and payment made at this time. During breakfast club, pupils can have breakfast and participate in activities.
- 'Tea Club' runs until 5.30pm and costs £9 per session, at present.
- After-school clubs run after school until 4.15 p.m. There is a charge of £25.00 per term to cover the costs of coaching and resourcing, with reductions for some families*. Clubs need to be booked online and payment made at this time.

Extra – curricular clubs

- Signing up for a club means attending every week. For safeguarding purposes, we do an attendance register every session. Office staff then follow up those who haven't attended, to ensure all pupils are safe. If your child cannot attend for a valid reason, e.g. a medical appointment, please inform the classteacher with a letter. If a child doesn't attend for a two-week period, the place will be lost and passed onto another child. There will be no refund in this case.
- Clubs charges, of £25.00 per term, are necessary to cover the cost of coaching, staffing and resourcing.
